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financial harvest commensurate with every need—both in my ministry and my personal life. God's Word says, And God is able to make all grace abound toward you, that you, always having all sufficiency in all things, may have an abundance for every good work (2 Corinthians 9:8).

Although abundance is a promise from God, its manifestation in our lives is not guaranteed. If I weren't a sower, then God would have to violate His own Word to give me an abundant harvest. He is the one who established the principle of sowing and reaping when He said, "While the earth remains, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, winter and summer, and day and night shall not cease" (Genesis 8:22). Planet Earth is still here; therefore, the law of seedtime and harvest is still in effect.

The Word of God says, Do not be deceived, God is not mocked: for whatever a man sows, that he will also reap (Galatians 6:7). This verse teaches us that we each determine our own harvest through the seed we sow. I can't determine your harvest, and you can't determine mine.

When the Bible says God is not mocked, it means He is will not be "ridiculed" or "treated with

contempt." The word contempt means "showing no respect for." In other words, when someone says, "I don't believe my sowing or my words have anything to do with the size of my harvest," that person's words demonstrate contempt because they show no respect for God and His Word. Talking this way will not produce an abundant harvest. The Phillips translation of Galatians 6:7 says, A man's harvest in life will depend entirely on what he sows.

The Bible says, He who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully (2 Corinthians 9:6). Paul wrote these words under the inspiration of the Holy Ghost, but it was God who established this principle. To sow sparingly is to sow modestly, seldom, or infrequently. According to God's laws, if we sow bountifully, then we will reap a bountiful harvest.

When people say, "Times are hard, Brother Jerry. How can I be sure that if I sow, I'll get a harvest?" I always think of the biblical account of Isaac. He lived in a day when famine was so severe in the land that he considered going to Egypt to live. But the Lord told him to stay where he was and He would bless him. The Bible says, Then Isaac sowed in that land, and

reaped in the same year a hundredfold; and the Lord blessed him. The man began to prosper, and continued prospering until he became very prosperous (Genesis 26:12-13). Isaac sowed in obedience to God's instructions, and he reaped an abundant harvest-even during a time of great famine.

We Are to Be Harvest Minded

Let's look again at the prophetic word Jesus spoke about the harvest: "The harvest truly is great, but the laborers are few; therefore pray the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into His harvest" (Luke 10:2). Our God is a harvest-minded God; therefore, we are to be harvest-minded people. Becoming harvest-minded prepares us to receive the great harvest Jesus prophesied over two thousand years ago. When it comes to the financial harvest, where we sow our seed has everything to do with the outcome. I was still a child when I first learned this principle on the Mississippi farm where I was born.

My grandfather purchased the farm in 1927. The land was a selfsustaining environment that enabled my grandparents to make it through the Great Depression that began in 1929. My dad was born and raised on the farm, and

a few years after I was born there, my parents and I moved to Louisiana. During my school years I spent every summer at the farm, and I especially loved going to the fields with my grandfather. At that time the farm was about eighty acres, half of which was planted with crops, the other half used for maintaining cattle and

I remember riding on the back of my grandfather's 1927 Massey Ferguson tractor as we headed to sow seed in an area known as "the flat." Every year Grandpa would declare, "Son, we're going to have a great crop this year!"

I'd say, "Grandpa, you say that every year. How do you know we're going to have a great crop?"

"Son, this is good old Mississippi Delta soil. You can grow anything here."

Grandpa was right; it was good soil. In fact, agriculturalists tell us even now that the flooding of the Mississippi River over the years has brought nutrients and minerals from the north to the mouth of the Mississippi, making the soil there some of the richest and most fertile in the world. Grandpa could have planted most anything in that soil and reaped an abundant harvest.

After I surrendered my life to the Lord and He began to teach me His Word, I envisioned my grandfather's farm when I read what Jesus had to say about the sower.

"Listen! Behold, a sower went out to sow. And it happened, as he sowed, that some seed fell by the wayside; and the birds of the air came and devoured it. Some fell on stony ground, where it did not have much earth; and immediately it sprang up because it had no depth of earth. But when the sun was up it was scorched, and because it had no root it withered away. And some seed fell among the thorns; and the thorns grew up and choked it, and it yielded no crop. But other seed fell on good ground and yielded a crop that sprang up, increased and produced: some thirtyfold, some sixty, and some a hundred" (Mark 4:3-8).

Notice Jesus said seed sown on good ground has the ability to produce a hundredfold return. This huge return is the exact amount Isaac harvested when he sowed in obedience to God's instruction: Then Isaac sowed in that land, and reaped in the same year a hundredfold (Genesis 26:12). To keep the soil of my own ministry productive, I've endeavored to keep my life pure for the past fifty years. There's never been a scandal in either my personal life or my ministry. I've been faithful to God, my wife, my family, and my calling. I intend to keep the soil of my ministry as rich and fertile as the goodole Mississippi-Delta soil I was raised on, because where we sow has everything to do with the kind of harvest we get.

We can sow our financial seed in good ground; however, doing our part by being willing to do with our expertise. Second, we myself. are to be willing to hear and obey the Rhema Word of God when it comes to us.

Work in Line with Our Expertise

Most of us are familiar with the Deuteronomy 28 blessings pronounced on those who would pay heed to the voice of God and obev His commandments. But I want to call particular attention to verse 12: The Lord will open to you His good treasure, the heavens, to give the rain to your land in its season, and to bless all the work of your hand. God promised to bless the work of our hands, which may be why the psalmist said, And establish the work of our hands for us; yes, establish the work of our hands (Psalms 90:17).

One time I was preaching at a large meeting at Victory Christian Center in Tulsa, Oklahoma. After the evening service a man came up to me and said, "Brother Jerry, I know you're a classic-car enthusiast and you still enjoy restoring those cars."

"That's right," I said.

"Well, I have a 1957 Thunderbird I'm going to sell because I need a financial miracle. The car needs some work, but I'm going to sell it for less than its value because I need \$5,000. If you're willing to buy this car for \$5,000, it would help me greatly," he said.

> Not long before I went to that meeting in Tulsa, I had given a person in need of a car some money toward the purchase of a vehicle. I didn't give the full price of the car, only the balance

of what was needed. I sowed that amount to the person, and then a short time later the Lord gave me the opportunity to purchase the 1957 Thunderbird for \$5,000. After putting \$2,500 into the restoration of the Thunderbird, I sold it for \$25,000—a profit of \$17,500. The Lord indeed blessed the work of my hands, and He did so in an astonishing way.

The abundant harvest sometimes comes when God arranges for us to do something in line with our expertise; however, the harvest doesn't show up unless we first sow a seed. God knew I had expertise in restoring classic automobiles, and after I sowed a seed to help someone purchase a car in Texas, He gave me the opportunity to put my hand to work and make a \$25,000 profit on my own vehicle. Once that profit came into being, I sent the man who'd sold me the T-bird another \$5000, which produced yet another harvest for me in an astounding way.

God can produce an abundant harvest for us through the work of our hands—or any other way He wants to. He can even rain down money on us from the sky. I used to say such a scenario could never happen, but I was wrong.

I was preaching in Chicago the winter of 1979 when a blizzard hit. Snow was everywhere, but it didn't stop the meeting. At the end of the service, the pastor received an offering, which the ushers presented to him in a bucket. Instead of counting the offering and putting it in a bank bag, the pastor left it in the bucket so that we could quickly leave the church and get into his car. Just as we stepped out the back door, a strong gust of wind blew the bucket out of the pastor's hand and into the air, sweeping the money away. We realized that within seconds it would be blown all over the neighborhood, so we didn't bother to look for it.

I can imagine people getting up the next morning, finding different denominations of green cash lying on their snow-covered lawns, and declaring, "God really does rain down money from heaven!"

No matter how God blesses us, whether through the work of our hands, by raining down money from the sky, or through any other means. He is able to make the abundance come to us in astonishing ways—ways that will both surprise and amaze us.

Hear and Obey the Rhema Word of God

To reap the abundant harvest God intends for us, we must also be willing to hear and obey the Rhema Word of God-a word spoken for our direction. We see this principle in action in the following familiar story from the book of Luke:

So it was, as the multitude pressed about Him to hear the word of God, that He stood by the Lake of Gennesaret, and saw two boats standing by the lake; but the fishermen had gone from them and

were washing their nets. Then He got into one of the boats, which was Simon's, and asked him to put out a little from the land. And He sat down and taught the multitudes from the boat.

When He had stopped speaking, He said to Simon, "Launch out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch."

But Simon answered and said to Him, "Master, we have toiled all night and caught nothing; nevertheless at Your word I will let down the net." And when they had done this, they caught a great number of fish, and their net was breaking. So they signaled to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled the boats, so that they began to sink. When Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord!"

For he and all who were with him were astonished at the catch of fish which they had taken (Luke 5:1-

I want to make two points about this story: First, Peter's abundant harvest was directly related to his willingness to work with his hands in his area of expertise, which was fishing. Second, Jesus spoke the Rhema Word of God to Peter, telling him exactly where to lower his nets. Peter's choice to listen and obey resulted in an abundant harvest.

You may say, "Wait a minute, Brother Jerry, how could Peter reap an abundant harvest if he never first sowed a seed?" But he did sow a seed. Iesus had need of a boat. When Peter loaned the Lord his boat, that boat was Peter's seed. When Jesus later said, "Launch out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch," that Rhema Word of God became Peter's key to a miracle breakthrough.

Notice Peter didn't ask, "Why didn't I catch any fish today? I'm a fisherman; it's what I do," nor did Peter ask for any advice from Jesus. If the Lord hadn't asked Peter to use his boat, Peter would have gone home and missed out on an abundant harvest. But when Jesus spoke the Rhema Word of God into Peter's particular situation, Peter's obedience triggered the miraclebreakthrough harvest he needed.

Peter's willingness to sow a seed in response to a need, set in motion activity in the Spirit realm that caused a harvest of fish, the likes of which had never before been seen in the local fishing industry. Nets began to break, and boats began to sink as these experienced fishermen were astonished at their catch.

The point I want to make is this: when we sow a seed, we need to listen to God! Like Peter, we may have expertise in a particular area—but Jesus knows even more than we do about our areas of expertise. Willingness to work with our hands or to use our training in a particular field for the purpose of reaping a harvest is necessary; however, the Rhema Word of God will direct

us to the abundant harvest God has prepared for us.

Finally, it is important that we water the seed we've sown; we do this by confessing God's Word over our seed. I invite you to speak the scripture verses I confess over my seed, followed by my personal declarations below, and join me in preparing to receive the abundant harvest God has for us—every day of our lives!

Declarations for **Abundant Harvest**

"While the earth remains, seedtime and harvest ... shall not cease" (Genesis 8:22). I sow my seeds in faith, knowing that the prosper" (2 Chronicles 20:20). I law of seedtime and harvest is working in my behalf. I'm expecting a harvest.

And God is able to make all grace abound toward you, that you, always having all sufficiency in all things, may have an abundance for every good work (2) Corinthians 9:8). I expect to have all sufficiency, more than enough, abounding in financial blessing, so that I'm able to sow into every good work the Holy Spirit impresses me to bless.



into my life. "Give, and it will be given to you: good measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over will be put into your bosom. For with the same measure that you use, it will be measured back to you" (Luke 6:38). I expect good measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over on every harvest for every seed I've sown.

He who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully (2 Corinthians 9:6). I'm entitled to, and I'm expecting, a bountiful harvest because I'm a bountiful sower.

"Believe in the Lord your God, and you shall be established; believe His prophets, and you shall believe in the Lord my God, and I believe what His prophet has spoken regarding my season of abundant harvest; therefore, I expect this harvest every day of my life.

Our prophet, Brother Kenneth Copeland, declared 2019 "The Year of Abundant Harvest." Jerry Savelle said it would be a year of "marvels, wonders, and extraordinary manifestations of the greatness of God."

In the natural, the time of bringing in the harvest has always been a season of great joy and celebration. But a natural harvest doesn't just happen on its own; someone must take the necessary steps to bring about the harvest. The ground must be prepared and seed must be sown. Once sown, the seed must be protected and watered.

When I was a child, my parents planted a large vegetable garden

serving it in glass jars) and prepare other items for the freezer. This was hard work for two little girls who didn't understand that God's law of seedtime and harvest ensured there would be food in our tummies for the rest of the

God established the law of seedtime and harvest in the book of Genesis when He said, "While the earth remains, seedtime and harvest ... shall not cease" (Genesis 8:22). This law is still in force—both in the natural and in the realm of the Spirit. Paul picked up on this fact in the New Testament, saying, Do not be deceived, God is not mocked: for whatever a man sows, that he

him. So if, when you are offering your gift at the altar, you remember that your brother has any grievance against you—or you have a grievance against someone—leave your gift at the altar and go, first make peace with your brother, and then come back and present your gift.

It is important that we come to terms quickly with any offense we may be harboring; this is how we prepare our hearts before sowing a seed. But once the seed is sown, we must protect it and water it.



each year. Before they sowed their seed, the ground had to be prepared. I'll never forget the endless hours of walking up and down each row, preparing the ground with the Rototiller. When my dad thought the ground had been worked enough, he would then plant the seed. Throughout the summer the garden had to be watered and weeded as those seeds grew into big, healthy plants that produced many types of vegetables.

My sister and I always dreaded harvest time due to the amount of work involved in the process. From daylight to dark we would be in the garden picking produce. But harvesting wasn't the end of the process; we then had to help mother with the canning of some of the produce (meaning prewill also reap (Galatians 6:7). The Phillips translation says, A man's harvest in life will depend entirely on what he sows.

Simply put, we cannot expect to reap the prophesied abundant harvest of 2019 if we have not done our part in first sowing seed. It's important to understand that sowing should never be done on the spur of the moment or haphazardly. Before sowing a seed or giving an offering, we must work the ground of our hearts, for the most important part of sowing is the preparation of the heart. I like to paraphrase Matthew 5:22-24 like this:

I say to you that everyone who continues to be angry with his brother harbors malice (enmity of heart) against

Protect the Seed

Years ago the Lord revealed to Jerry and me the importance of protecting our seed. We were in a service listening to another minister preach when Jerry leaned over to me and said, "Carolyn, the Holy Spirit just spoke to me and said, 'Give that man your airplane." I said, "Well, we need to obey the Lord, so you have my agreement to do that." It turned out that minister had been standing in faith for the exact kind of airplane we had, and the Lord

used us to manifest the answer to his prayers.

Sowing that airplane was a large and significant seed to us; it was our transportation to and from meetings all over the U.S.; therefore, we would have to fly on commercial airlines until our new plane manifested.

A short time after sowing that seed we learned the minister had sold the airplane and put the money into something that, in our opinion, was questionable. That's how offense took root in our hearts. Any time someone mentioned the man's name, I couldn't think nice or kind thoughts. I wouldn't use my words against him; I just wouldn't say anything nice about him.

About that time the Lord gave Jerry a powerful sermon titled "Keep the Weeds off Your Seeds." When he shared the message with me, we knew what we had to do: We joined hands and prayed, asking the Lord to forgive us for the unforgiveness in our hearts toward that minister. We repented and then replanted our seed (the airplane) with hearts full of love and forgiveness. What were we doing? We were tilling and preparing the ground of our hearts for the seed we'd already sown.

The very next morning we went to a ministers' conference and the first person we saw when we entered the room was the man we'd prayed for the night before. We were able to talk to him with love in our hearts. He never knew we'd had any negative feelings because we'd taken care of the matter privately in our "prayer

closet" with God.

We'd been flying commercial for several years as we waited for our new airplane to manifest; however, the seed we'd sown hadn't yet produced a harvest because of the weeds that were on it. After Jerry and I prayed, the very next day our new airplane manifested! Again, the Word of God says, Do not be deceived, God is not mocked: for whatever a man sows,

that he will also reap (Galatians 6:7). In the Bible's account of creation. we find this statement: And the Lord God took the man, and put him into the garden of Eden to dress it and to keep it (Genesis 2:15 KJV). When I looked up the word keep in the Hebrew language, I learned it means "to put a hedge of thorns around; to watch over; to guard, protect, and safeguard." In other words, when we continue to walk in love, keeping unforgiveness, bitterness, and strife out of our hearts, in essence we are pulling up the weeds that surround our seed. We are watching over, protecting, and safeguarding our precious seed.

When I consider this process of protecting our seed, I can't help but think of the weed popper I use in my garden. On the end of a pole are four prongs that surround the weed when I press down with my foot. I twist the handle and the weed pops out roots and all. It takes effort to remove some of the weeds from my grass, but I do it. It also takes effort to remove weeds from the soil of our heart, the wounds and pain caused by difficult situations. We remove these weeds through forgiveness, and then finding a scripture to stand on and quote out loud as we believe God to remove the weed from our seed.

Water the Seed

We understand the importance in the natural to prepare the ground for seed and to protect it once it's sown. But this isn't the end of the work on our part. Unless a seed it watered it will remain dormant in the ground; it will not germinate.

I learned this truth as a child in my parents' garden. If we didn't get rain, we had to water the garden daily. We'd hook up a long hose to the outdoor faucet and

put a sprinkler on the end of it. We'd place the sprinkler in the garden, checking on it and moving it about during the day so that every inch of the garden was watered. We made sure that the seed we'd sown would survive and grow.

So how do we water the spiritual seed we've sown? By praise and thanksgiving-and quoting out loud the Scripture that pertains to our harvest. Following are some of the verses I quote over the seed I've sown:

Let the people praise thee, O God; let all the people praise thee. Then shall the earth yield her increase; and God, even our own God, shall bless us (Psalm 67:5-6 KJV).

He who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully (2 Corinthians 9:6).

And God is able to make all grace abound toward you, that you, always having sufficiency in all things, may have an abundance for every good work (2 Corinthians 9:8).

The Lord has been mindful of us; He will bless us. May the Lord give you increase more and more, you and your children (Psalm 115:12, 14).

Give, and it will be given to you; good measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over will be put into your bosom. For with the same measure that you use, it will be measured back to you (Luke 6:38).

Still other seeds fell on fertile soil, and they produced a crop that was thirty, sixty, and even a hundred times as *much as had been planted!* (Matthew 13:8).

Aren't these promises exciting news?

The Lord has been mindful of us; He will bless us. May the Lord give you increase more and more, you and your children (Psalm 115:12, 14).



Just as we had to move that sprinkler around to make sure every area where we'd planted seed in our garden received water, so we must do with the seed we sow in the Spirit. When we water this seed daily with praise, worship, thanksgiving, and speaking the Word of God, we can be certain

of an abundant harvest in due season.

The Bible says, Behold, the hire [harvest] of the labourers who have reaped down your fields, which is of you kept back by fraud, crieth; and the cries of them which have reaped [the harvest] are entered into the ears of the Lord of sabaoth (James 5:4 NKJV, brackets added). The word sabaoth means "harvest." In other words, we are to cry out to the Lord of the harvest! To cry out means "to proclaim and demand immediate action with aggressive force and passion."

When we cry out to the Lord of the harvest, we put Satan in his place, telling him that he cannot hold back our harvest. We can also send our harvesting angels into the harvest, declaring "Bring it in for me, in Jesus' name!" For the Word of God says, Are not all angels ministering spirits sent to serve those who will inherit salvation? (Hebrews 1:14 NIV).







The Jerry Savelle Bible School based in Aruscha, provides the Bible school curriculum on tablets to African pastors enabling them to train and learn the Word in their own home towns. This school is growing in popularity and influence as graduates spread throughout the country demonstrating what they've learned at the school. The power of the Holy Spirit is clearly upon them as they win souls, teach the Word, and start churches.

One student, Bishop Elibarik Mollel, had a single struggling church when he enrolled in the school. There are five HFCC churches in the Arusha/Meru region, with plans to establish two more. "Most of this growth represents new believers rather than transfer growth. God is doing great and marvelous things!"

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Throughout my life as a believer, I have been guided by many nuggets of truth from people such as my parents, my childhood pastor Jonathan Willey, Dr. and Mrs. Savelle, Kenneth E. Hagin, Brother Copeland, and many others. However, there is one truth each of them deposited in me that continues to guide me today: God loves me and has a plan for my life. It's a good plan—a plan to prosper me.

I had to come to the place where, no matter what my current situation may look like, I hold on to the truth that God's plan for my life was, is, and al-

prosper."

ways will be to prosper me. Each one of us has to put faith in this truth. When we are up against a difficult situation and the enemy surrounds us, we can take heart. God's plan remains the same.

At a time when and enemy surrounded the kingdom of Judah, the

people must have asked, What are we going to do? It was King Jehoshaphat who received instructions on what to do, but mostly what not to do, since the word of the Lord came through the prophet, saying, "Stand still and see the salvation of the Lord, who is with you" (2 Chronicles 20:17). Then as they faced their enemy, Jehoshaphat spoke up: "Hear me, O Judah and you inhabitants of Jerusalem; Believe in the Lord your God, and you shall be established; believe His prophets, and you shall prosper" (2 Chronicles 20:20).

Faith in God is what establishes us, which means "to be settled, firm, founded on something, immovable." We must understand that faith in God is what brings His plan to pass in our lives. Faith in God and faith in what God has spoken through His prophets will establish and prosper us. The story of Jehoshaphat ends with great victory as the people put their faith in God and what

the prophet declared as their course of action: "Believe in the Lord your God, and you shall be established; believe His prophets, and you shall prosper."

What is a prophet? A prophet is someone who speaks on behalf of God. Prophets speak words that reveal the Father's heart, desire, and plan. When we mix our faith with words that come from God, we are pushed into position to prosper.

What I've learned from those who have imported into my life is that faith is the currency of the kingdom. Currency is a medium of exchange. For example, if I

> want a new car I can't just go into the dealership and drive a vehicle off the lot. The dealer expects and exchange. Money is the medium of exchange I use to receive the car I desire.

Faith is the currency of the kingdom of God. The Scripture doesn't merely say, For by grace you have been saved. It says, *For by*

grace you have been saved through faith (Ephesians 2:8). I receive salvation by grace, but it is through faith. Everything that has been made available by our heavenly Father is received by grace, but through faith. Faith is the medium of change, the currency.

Let's look again at 2 Chronicles 20:20: "Believe in the Lord your God, and you shall be established; believe His prophets, and you shall prosper." The heart of the Father is to prosper us. The word prosper in the original Hebrew language is tsalach, which means "to break out; to go over; to be sufficient; to flourish; to succeed; to finish well." I believe abundant harvest is connected to our releasing our faith in the Word of God, the will of God, and the plan of God. Faith is the currency that brings His will to pass in our lives.

When we look at the life of David we find him in a situation similar to Jehoshaphat's. In Psalm 27 David writes

about an army encamped against him. Though war was rising against him, he declared that he would be confident. In other words, David was firm in his faith. Remember, faith is the currency of heaven. David declared, I would have lost heart, unless I had believed that I would see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living (Psalm 27:13). David's faith and dependence on God was the currency that brought the goodness of God into his life.

David wasn't looking to other things to be his answer; he was determined he would see the goodness of God in his life. The surety of his faith is revealed in verse 14: Wait on the Lord; be of good courage, and He shall strengthen your heart; wait, I say, on the Lord! Waiting on the Lord reveals a heart that is positioned in faith. And recall, faith is the currency of heaven—the medium of exchange that brings the goodness of God to pass in the land of the living.

There was a time in Paul's life when he too faced a situation similar to that of Jehoshaphat's and David's. His remedy was the same as theirs: faith in God. Paul said, For we do not want you to be ignorant, brethren, of our trouble which came to us in

Asia: that we were burdened beyond measure, above strength, so that we despised even of life. Yes, we had the sentence of death in ourselves, that we should not trust in ourselves but in God who raises the dead, who delivered us from so great a death, that does deliver us; in whom we trust that He will still deliver us, you also by helping together in prayer for us, that thanks may be given by many persons on our behalf through the gift granted to us through many (emphasis added).

The answer for Paul's seemingly impossible situation was trusting in the God who raises the dead, the God who can do impossible things. Faith the currency that causes the impossible to be possible.

In every Bible account of individuals using faith to overcome impossible circumstances, we can see that God's plan doesn't change. His desire for our lives remains the same. No matter what hardship or negative circumstance we may face, His plan is to prosper us. The Word of God says, Beloved, I pray that you may prosper in all things and be in health, just as your soul prospers (3 John 2) and Cast not away therefore your confidence, which hat great recompence of reward

(Hebrews 10:35 KJV).

I've learned to simply put my faith in God, for His plan of prosperity to come to pass in my life. Faith is my currency. If I'll stick with God, wait on God, believe God, and believe what His prophets have said, then I'll see the goodness of God in the land of the living.

I invite you to join me now and believe the prophet's declaration that 2019 is the year of the abundant harvest. This is God's plan, will, and desire for you—no matter what your present circumstances may look like. Your faith is the currency that will bring God's prophetic word to pass!
