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# Whatever happened to true allegiance?

When I grew up, we started each school day with the Pledge of Allegiance. I remember standing with my classmates, hands on our hearts, saying the familiar words each morning, always followed by the Lord's Prayer.

Prayer was taken out of our schools on June 25, 1962, when the U.S. Supreme Court declared school-sponsored prayers unconstitutional, and now, fifty-eight years later, blatant disrespect and desecration of our flag is accepted by many as a right of free speech. As the saying goes, those who disrespect our flag have never been handed a folded one. Little wonder our country is in the condition it's in.

I, for one, am glad I don't live in a communist-ruled or socialist country, yet many in our nation are desperately doing all they can to take the United States this direction. We must not let this happen!

I never thought I'd see the day when Americans would vote for those who promote forms of communism or socialism. Apparently, they've never visited a communist or socialist country—but I have. I've had the privilege of preaching in forty-six nations, and I've seen what people living in nondemocratic countries go through. Every time I return to the U.S. I want to kiss the ground and thank God that I'm blessed to be an American.

I was recently stirred in my spirit to speak up about the things I see happening in our nation. This is not something I normally do because I'm called to preach the Word of God. But the very Word of God says, *Preach the word; be instant in season, out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort with all longsuffering and doctrine* (2 Timothy 4:2 KJV).

God has given me a voice, not only to the Church but also to our nation and the world. When it comes to standing up and speaking out, according to the Bible I'm in good company. Interestingly, when God called one of His servants to speak forth His will, it oftentimes had to do with injustice.

After God's people had been held in slavery by the Egyptians for 430 years, the Lord called Moses, saying, "I have surely seen the oppression of My people who are in Egypt, and have heard their cry because of their taskmasters, for I know their sorrows. So I have come down to deliver them out of the hand of the Egyptians ... Come now, therefore, and I will send you to Pharaoh that you may bring My people, the children of Israel, out of Egypt" (Exodus 3:7–8, 9).

When Moses obeyed God and confronted not only Pharaoh, but in essence all the gods of Egypt, the Lord performed numerous signs and wonders as He led His people out of the injustice of bondage with a strong hand.

Centuries later, when God's people fell into sin and rebellion thus opening the door for the Babylonian King Nebuchadnezzar to destroy Jerusalem and its temple, the Lord used the prophet Isaiah to address the injustice: *Regarding Zion, I can't keep my mouth shut, regarding Jerusalem, I can't hold my tongue, until her righteousness blazes down like the sun and her salvation flames up like a torch* (Isaiah 62:1 MSG). Isaiah used both his voice and his influence to declare that which was right in the sight of God.

John the Baptist was described as *"The voice of one crying in the wilderness; 'Prepare the way of the LORD; make His paths straight"* (Matthew 3:3). As a God-ordained voice, John would have been wrong to remain silent. When the apostle Paul arrived in Athens, the Bible says his spirit was stirred in him, when he saw the city wholly given to idolatry (Acts 17:16 KJV). The Amplified Bible, Classic Edition, says his spirit was grieved and roused to anger.

### Stand Up, Church!

I'm not in any way comparing myself to any of these great men; however, I do understand what it is to be grieved in spirit and roused to anger as I have been recently. The word *roused* means Had Paul lived in our day, he would have gone to the local church!

In other words, the spiritual condition of a city, state, or nation is a direct reflection on the Church, the body of Christ. God's Word is clear about His people's responsibility and

"provoked to activity." So, what kind of activity was Paul provoked to do? He didn't go to the city hall and blame the government for the condition the city was in; he went to the synagogue and disputed with the religious leaders. authority in the matter, for He said, "If My people who are called by My name will humble themselves, and pray and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land" (2 Chronicles 7:14).

Notice God didn't say, "If the people of the world will humble themselves," or "If the Republicans and Democrats will humble themselves." While it's easy to blame the division in our country on politicians, in reality the



Church is not doing its job.

I'll be the first to admit that our nation has serious problems. We live in a fallen world; therefore, as long as sin exists so will all forms of injustice. But as the Church, it is our job to speak out against it, to bring healing to those who have suffered.

The sin of racism still exists in our nation. Not surprisingly, there are those who do not want it to end because it would bring an end to their paychecks—and I'm not speaking solely of white people. Sin cannot be overcome by sin. Only the love of God in the person of Jesus Christ, who paid the penalty for sin once and for all with His blood, can change hearts and remove the stain of sin from our nation.

I was raised in a family where I was taught to love God, my family, my fellow man, and my nation. Though I was raised to pledge allegiance to the flag, and would never dishonor the American flag by burning it or taking a knee, in no way means I'm for social injustice.

I was born in Mississippi, one of the most historically racist states in the Union, yet neither my family nor I were or are racists. My family lived on a gravel road; ours was one of four white families in a predominately black rural area where everyone got along together. Many of my playmates were black children; I ate at their family tables and they ate at ours. We were friends; we didn't know we were supposed to dislike each other because of the color of our skin.

In 2019, Jerry Savelle Ministries International celebrated its fiftieth anniversary in ministry. I'm pleased to say that for forty of those years we've had ongoing ministry in Africa, meeting the needs of the people through food distribution and healthcare, establishing churches, and raising up pastors and leaders. It has been my honor to take the gospel of Jesus Christ to people of all nations and races.

Martin Luther King, Jr. once said, "There comes a time when silence is betrayal. Our lives begin to end the day we become silent about things that matter." That's why at our church, Heritage of Faith Christian Center in Crowley, Texas, we have not been silent about the injustice of racism. We've publicly acknowledged racism as sin and have asked forgiveness of those who've been affected by it. As founder of the church, I've prayed that those affected will never again know another day of bondage, hate, prejudice, or inequality. The Bible says, For you are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus. For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ (Galatians 3:26-28).

At Heritage of Faith Christian Center, we have each other's backs.

#### Signs of the Times

Though we've never before seen anything like the turmoil going on in the world today, we shouldn't be surprised because it's been prophesied. The Bible speaks of the end times, saying, *But know this, that in the last days perilous times will come* (2 Timothy 3:1). The Amplified Bible, Classic Edition says, *perilous times of great stress and trouble [hard to deal with and hard to bear]*, and the Passion Translation says, *the culture of society will become extremely fierce and difficult.* 

The word *fierce* in this verse means *"marked by extreme violence; inclined to react violently.*" This fierceness is exactly what we see played out in our nation today, just as it was in Jesus' *continued* ... day. In Matthew 8 we read the account of Jesus entering an area where He encountered two demon-possessed men coming out of the tombs They were described as *"exceedingly fierce, so that no one could pass that way"* (see verse 28). The Passion Translation says they were *"considered so extremely violent that no one felt safe passing through the area."* 

So, where does this fierce, violent spirit come from? Obviously from Satan, who inspires the violence, burning of buildings, terrorizing of people, and killing of children that we currently see played out in some American cities. If Martin Luther King, Jr. were alive today, he would likely be appalled—such lawlessness is certainly not what he dreamed. Yet it has all been prophesied.

Looking again at 2 Timothy, we see eighteen moral or ethical character flaws that would be prevalent in the last days, which we see manifesting right now. The Bible says that people will be:

- Lovers of themselves
- Lovers of money
- Boasters
- Proud
- Blasphemers
- Disobedient to parents
- Unthankful
- Unholy
- Unloving
- Unforgiving
- Slanderers
- Without self-control
- Brutal
- Despisers of good
- Traitors
- Headstrong
- Haughty
- Lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God

When asked which was the greatest commandment in God's law, Jesus said, "You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind" (Matthew 22:27). He also said, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another" (John 13:34). When it comes to the absence of allegiance to God, family, our fellow man, and our nation, many people fit Paul's description in Romans 1:28 (KJV): *And even as they did not like to retain God in their knowledge, God gave them over to a reprobate mind, to do those things which are not convenient.* To have a reprobate mind is to be without scruples, to lack discipline, to be obstinate and wayward, to embrace distorted and twisted thinking, and to resist moral guidance.

Paul says, But evil men and seducers shall wax worse and worse, deceiving, and being deceived (2 Timothy 3:8 KJV). In other words, we haven't seen the worst of it yet. Jesus said, "For false christs and false prophets will rise and show great signs and wonders to deceive, if possible, even the elect. See I have told you beforehand" (Matthew 24:24–25). The Message says, "Their impressive credentials and dazzling performances will pull the wool over the eyes of even those who ought to know better."

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Right now, the wool is being pulled over the eyes of many people in our nation, yet there is good news. The Bible says, For behold, the darkness shall cover the earth, and deep darkness the people; but the LORD will arise over you, and His glory will be seen upon you (Isaiah 60:2). Though people will be in deep darkness, God's people, His Church, will become brighter and brighter.

Years ago, Hilton Sutton, one of the world's foremost authorities on the prophetic Scriptures, wrote a book titled *Rapture–Get Right or Get Left*. I believe we are approaching the rapture of the Church that Brother Sutton described in his book; *however, before it happens God is going to have a glorious Church, which the Bible describes as not having spot or wrinkle or any such thing, but that she should be holy and without blemish* (Ephesians 5:27).

We indeed live in strange times, unusual times in which sin abounds and allegiance to God and country is—for many—cast aside in favor of ungodliness and lawlessness. But the Bible says, *And yet, wherever sin increased, there was more than enough of God's grace to triumph all the more!* (Romans 5:20 TPT).

You and I are part of God's end-time, glorious Church; therefore, I invite you to join me in making this declaration:

What a magnificent, faithful God we serve! To those who love Him and keep His commandments, He promises to show covenant faithfulness to a thousand generations (see Exodus 20:6). Writers of the New Testament often speak of God's faithfulness. These are a few of my favorite scripture verses:

*If we are faithless, he remains faithful, for he cannot disown himself* (2 Timothy 2:13 NIV).

Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful. (Hebrews 10:23)

God is faithful, by whom you were called into fellowship of His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. (1 Corinthians 1:9) Throughout the Word of God, we see countless examples of God's faithfulness to His people; but what of our faithfulness to God? The Bible is clear on the matter: *Now it is required that those who have been given a trust must prove faithful* 

(1 Corinthians 4:2 NIV).

Jesus affirmed this truth in His parable of the bags of gold, saying, *"His master replied*, *'Well done, good and faithful servant! You have been faithful with a few things; I will put you in charge of many things. Come and share your master's happiness*" (Matthew 25:21 NIV).

God has given each of us a life to live, a destiny to fulfill, which is often referred to as "the race of faith" based on Hebrews 12:1: Let us run with endurance the race that is set before us. The Amplified Bible, Classic Edition, says, Let us run with patient endurance and steady and active persistence the appointed course of the race that is set before us. Finishing the race requires faithfulness!

The apostle Paul loved Timothy as a son; therefore, he wrote to him as a father would write to a son. He called upon Timothy to abandon fear and rekindle the flame within him (see 2 Timothy 1:6 NIV). Apparently, Timothy needed some words of reassurance, as we all do from time to time.

#### The Rewards of Faithfulness

Christians who diligently run their spiritual races will receive rewards for their faithfulness at the judgment seat of Christ. The moment we trust Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior, our sins are forgiven and we qualify to enter the holy presence of God in heaven, for the Bible says, *Therefore, there is now*  no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus (Romans 8:1). All of our sins—past, present, and future—were paid for on Calvary's cross.

When we stand before the judgment seat of Christ, our faithful service to Him will be evaluated and rewarded. With perfect knowledge He will assess our every thought, motive, and action. The prospect of His coming judgment should motivate us to be more like Christ in our daily lives, running our spiritual races towards His heavenly rewards.

The New Testament describes five different heavenly rewards, referred to as "crowns."

The Victor's Crown: Everyone who competes in the games goes into strict training. They do it to get a crown that will not last, but we do it to get a crown that will last forever (1 Corinthians 9:25–27 NIV). Serving God involves narrowing our focus to those things with the highest eternal value. Life is full of good things that can take our focus off the best Christ has to offer; therefore, it's up to us to identify and choose those things of eternal value. Those who exercise such discipline will receive the Victor's Crown.

The Crown of Rejoicing: For what is our hope, our joy, or the crown of rejoicing? Is it not even you in the presence of our Lord Jesus Christ at His coming? (1 Thessalonians 2:19). This crown is awarded to those who bring others to Christ. Often called the "soul winner's crown," the Crown of Rejoicing is given to those who reach out beyond themselves so that Christ can take them to heaven.

The Crown of Righteousness: Finally, there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will give to me on that Day, and not to me only but also to all who have loved His appearing (2 Timothy 4:8). This crown is designated for those who long for Jesus' appearing, who live holy lives in anticipation of His return. We should never get so caught up in earthly activities that we forget heaven is our true home.

The Crown of Glory: And when the Chief shepherd appears, you will receive a crown of glory that does not fade away (1 Peter 5:4). This crown is given to faithful shepherds of God's people. Jesus said to His disciples, "The harvest is truly great, but the laborers are few" (Luke 10:2).

**The Crown of Life:** *My* brethren, count it all joy when you fall into various trials. Blessed is the man who endures temptation; for when he has been approved, he will receive the crown of life which the Lord has promised to those who love Him (James 1:2, 12).

#### The Reward of Eternal Life

What does it mean to have eternal life? Of course, we understand that the life we now live is what Jesus referred to as the "abundant life" when He said, "*I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly*" (John 10:10).

According to John 3:16, we also have access to eternal life, which has a beginning, but it has no end: For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life (John 3:16 NIV). Eternal life begins when we come in faith to Jesus Christ to receive Him as our Lord and Savior, to the new life that He alone can give. Jesus makes a difference here and now; He also gives us a life that has no end.

Jesus said, "In My Father's house are many mansions; if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself; that where I am, there you may be also" (John 14:1-3). He also told us that when He comes in His glory, He will say to those on His right hand, "Come, you blessed by My Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world" (Matthew 25:34). There is an inheritance that the Father has already prepared for the people whom He gave to His Son, and His inheritance is reserved for them.

Finally, the Bible says, "He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches. To him who overcomes I will give to eat from the tree of life, which is in the midst of the Paradise of God" (Revelation 2:7). What an amazing promise and beautiful picture of a wonderful garden.

For those who overcome, death loses its sting and access is granted to the Tree of Life through Jesus and the power of His resurrection (see 1 Corinthians 15:20–26, 54–58). Notice, the Tree of Life is for those who overcome, and the Scripture says, *And this is the victory that has overcome the world—our faith* (1 John 5:4).

The Tree of Life offers perpetual sustenance and healing as symbolized by its twelve fruits: *And on either side of the river, was the tree of life, which bore twelve fruits, each tree yielding its fruit every month. The leaves of the tree were for the healing of the nations* (Revelation 22:2). We get to be partakers of this tree—Glory to God!

Be faithful to God, for He rewards those who are faithful to Him!

# Loyalty & Faithfulness

Partners and friends of this ministry are familiar with the prophetic word the Lord gave me regarding this year: "In 2020, I will open a new door, and I will cause my faithful ones to experience supernatural increase as never before."

I preached this message to my home church for three weeks in a row, after which I began preaching it every place I went throughout the U.S. and the world, as well as on my television program.

And then the world was hit with a pandemic.

My first thought was, Isn't it interesting that in advance of a pandemic—which God obviously knew was coming— He would say that His faithful ones would yet experience supernatural increase as never before?

Now I've experienced supernatural increase nearly all of my Christian life, so when God used the term "as never before," that got my attention. I knew He was up to something big, and for me that "something" happened almost immediately.

The story begins forty years ago, when land south of Fort Worth was dirt cheap. I'm a country boy who likes my space, so I began buying parcels of property anywhere from ten to twenty or more acres at a time until I'd accumulated some two-hundred acres. Now, with Fort Worth's current exponential growth, my land has become quite attractive to builders. Long story short, I recently signed a contract to sell a parcel of my land, for which I paid \$240,000, to a builder for \$2.5 million. This money is going towards the construction of our new church auditorium. I'd call that supernatural increase as never before!

God said He would cause His faithful ones to flourish as never before, so let me ask you this: Are you faithful? Have you been faithful? The Bible says, For the eyes of the LORD run to and fro throughout the whole earth, to show himself strong in the behalf of those whose heart is perfect toward him (2 Chronicles 16:9 KJV). The Hebrew word translated perfect in this verse means "loyal, faithful, trustworthy, dependable." When Brother Copeland called me out during one of his meetings in Shreveport and said, "Jerry, stand up." Though I'd met him before, I was surprised he remembered my name. "I was in prayer today and the Lord showed me that you and I will be a

team, and we'll spend the rest of our lives preaching the Word of God around the world. But it will be your responsibility to believe God for the perfect timing for the team to begin. Now you can sit down."

I was so young in the Lord that I didn't know what had just happened. I turned to Carolyn, who'd been filled with the Holy Ghost since she was eight years old, and said, "What did all that mean?" She looked at me and said, "I think we're moving to Fort Worth."

It wasn't long before we moved to Fort Worth and I went to work for Brother Copeland. Though we now have two separate ministries, we continue to preach together throughout the world, and I remain a loyal and faithful partner to his ministry.

Carolyn and I recently celebrated fifty-four years of marriage, and I can say that I've been faithful to her, praise God! I've been faithful to my family, to my children, and grandchildren. We've now been blessed with a great-granddaughter, and I've already started being faithful to her. When she was three days old, I started a trust fund for her, which I faithfully contribute to each month. When she's old enough, she'll one day say, "Papa, you've been faithful."

The Bible poses this question: Most men will proclaim each his own goodness, but who can find a faithful man? (Proverbs 20:6). The Message says, Lots of people claim to be loyal and loving, but where on earth can you find one? Because I've been in the ministry for over fifty years, many young ministers refer to me as their spiritual father, yet there are some who don't welcome my input.

I don't know how many times I've had a young minister say to me, "Brother Jerry, I want you to speak into my life. If you see any fault or error, or an area where I need discipline, please tell me. I'm submitted to you." And then, when I do as they ask, I never hear from them again, leaving me to wonder what blessings they may be missing.

God blesses those who are loyal and faithful; He causes great things to happen in their behalf—just as He has always done from the beginning.

#### Faithful Abraham

In the book of Genesis we find the familiar story of Abraham, whose faithfulness was tested

when God instructed him to

offer his son Isaac as a sacrifice. So Abraham rose early in the morning and saddled his donkey, and took two of his young men with him, and Isaac his son; and he split the wood for the burnt offering, and arose and went to the place of which God had told him. Then on the third day Abraham lifted his eyes and saw the place afar off. And Abraham said to his young men, "Stay here with the donkey; the lad and I will go yonder and worship, and we will come back to you" (Genesis 22:3-5).

Notice Abraham said, "We will come back to you," despite the fact he was instructed to offer Isaac as a sacrifice. Why did Abraham say

such a thing to his servants? Because he knew God was faithful, that He doesn't lie. God had promised Abraham that a nation would come from his seed, Isaac, and dead boys can't produce seed!

So Abraham took the wood of the burnt offering and laid it on Isaac his son, and a knife, and the two of them went together. But Isaac spoke to Abraham his father and said, "My father!"

And he said, "Here I am, my son." Then he said, "Look, the fire and the wood, but where is the lamb for a burnt offering?"

And Abraham said, "My son, God will provide for Himself the lamb for a burnt offering" (Genesis 22:6–9).

Abraham saw through the eyes of faith what would happen, and God indeed provided the sacrifice that day in the form of a ram caught in a thicket. While this story points to the faithfulness of God, I want us to consider the faithfulness of Abraham.

When Abraham was ninety-nine



years old, God had commanded him, saying, *I am the Almighty God; walk before me, and be thou perfect* (Genesis 17:1 KJV). And now, years later, as he was about to offer his son, the angel of the Lord called out from heaven, *"Do not lay your hand on the lad, or do anything to him; for now I know that you fear God"* (Genesis 22:12). The Voice Bible says, *I now know that you respect the one true God and will be loyal to him.* Abraham's faithfulness to

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God was not measured in days, weeks, or months; rather, it was measured in years.

When Carolyn and I married, the preacher asked me, "Jerry, do you take this woman as your lawful wedded wife?" I said, "I do," and I meant it. At that moment I became a one-woman man. I'm sure, had I gone to Carolyn after being married for six months and proclaimed that I'd been faithful all that time, she would have appreciated it; however, six months is not an accurate



gauge of loyalty and faithfulness. But fifty-four years is another matter. Throughout our marriage both Carolyn and I have proven our faithfulness to each other and to God. And because of our faithfulness, we have been greatly blessed.

### Abounding in Blessings

The Bible makes this promise in Proverbs 28:20: *A faithful man will abound in blessings*. The New International Version says, *A faithful person will be richly blessed*, and The Passion Translation says, *Life's blessings drench the honest and faithful person*. This sounds like supernatural increase to me. If you are a faithful person, then you can declare with confidence, "That's me He's talking about!"

When it comes to faithfulness, it seems God is always looking for someone special. Throughout the Bible we see the connection between the great works of God and the prayers of His

> people, which is why He said through the prophet Ezekiel, And I sought for a man among them, that should make up the hedge, and stand in the gap before me for the land, that I should not destroy it: but I found none (Ezekiel 22:30 KJV). The Message says, I couldn't find anyone. Not one. To me, this is one of the saddest verses in the Bible—not one person was willing to work with God to see His purpose accomplished in the earth.

> I remember the first time I read 2 Chronicles 16:9: For the eyes of the LORD run to and fro throughout the whole earth, to show himself strong in

the behalf of those whose heart is perfect toward him. I'd been saved less than a year at the time, but I stood up, lifted my hands, and said, "Lord, if you're looking for someone who will be faithful, loyal, trustworthy, and dependable, then search no more; I'm your man." I've endeavored to prove my faithfulness to Him throughout all these years, and He's said to me exactly what He once said to Abraham, "I now know that you are faithful." God says the same thing to you too, affirming you are a candidate for supernatural increase beyond anything you've experienced before. Based upon the economic climate of the world in which we live, it's a great time for this promise to come to pass.

Jerry Savelle Ministries International has offices throughout the world. When the pandemic began in March of this year, I met with my staff at our home office in Texas and said, "We're not laying off anyone, and we're not reducing salaries. In fact, we're giving you a raise." We've not had to reduce staff anywhere around the world because God has continued to bless us. I believe He has done so because we've demonstrated our faithfulness to Him throughout the years.

When God makes a promise, He intends to keep it. God promised to bless Abraham, of whom the Bible says, And so, after he had patiently endured, he obtained the promise (Hebrews 6:15). I particularly like the way The Message renders this verse: Abraham stuck it out and got everything that had been promised to him.

God has promised that His faithful ones will flourish as never before. In closing, I want to offer this prayer in behalf of His faithful ones:

Father, I'm asking You to confirm the Word I've delivered in this message with signs following. I'm asking that every one of Your *faithful ones experience supernatural* increase beyond anything they ever experienced before. Lord, make things happen in their lives that will cause them to stand back and say, "Wow, only God could have made that happen." Cause Your divine favor to manifest in their lives in the most unusual ways, for with You, nothing is ever impossible. I pray this in Jesus' name. Amen.

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# Faithfulness To Family Carolyn Savelle

In the book of Genesis, which means "beginnings," we find the account of God establishing the foundation for the family. After He formed the bodies of the first man and woman, He declared, "*Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and they shall become one flesh*" (Genesis 2:24).

With this sanctified union came the power and potential to bring forth children, to raise up families in accordance with God's decree that mankind would "*Be fruitful and multiply*; *fill the earth and subdue it*; *have dominion*" (Genesis 1:28).

When God established His covenant of faithfulness with His people at Mount Sinai, only one of the ten laws he set forth had a promise with it: *"Honor your father and mother, that your days may be long upon the land which the LORD your God is giving you"* (Exodus 20:12).

The preceding Bible verses paint a clear picture of the original value God placed on the family. Then, in the book of Deuteronomy Moses described God's faithfulness to His family, saying, *"Therefore know that the LORD your God, He is God, the faithful God who keeps covenant and mercy for a thousand generations to those who love Him and keep His commandments"* (Deuteronomy 7:9).

The risen Jesus made this revealing statement to Mary: "Go to My brethren and say to them, 'I am ascending to My Father and your Father" (John 20:17), thus establishing our redemptive relationship with God as our heavenly Father. According to James 3:9, we get our similitude of fatherhood from Father God.

We know, of course, that to establish a family requires a father and a mother, both

of whom are created in God's image: So God created mankind in His own image ... male and female He created them (Genesis 1:27 NIV). However, I believe the role of the father in a family is currently under particular attack from Satan, whose desire is to make the picture of fatherhood and faithfulness obsolete.

The enemy knows that God intends for fathers to reflect specific aspects of His character, to be an earthly mirror of a heavenly reality. Jesus said, "Or what man is there among you who, if his son asks for bread, will give him a stone? Or if he asks for a fish, will he give him a serpent? If you then, being evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask Him!" (Matthew 7:9–11).

Godly fathers are to provide a connection to God's saving grace, because giving their children good gifts makes it easier for children to connect with a heavenly Father who gave them the best gift of all: His Son, who died on the cross for their sins.

If you have, or had, a wonderful dad and a lifetime of happy memories—celebrate that! But not everyone has had a good experience with an earthly father. Maybe you lost your dad; if so, the Bible says God is *a father to the fatherless* (Psalm 68:5). Maybe your dad tried his best, but he wasn't a great father. Perhaps your dad was a heartless, cruel man who did things that scared you or walked away long ago leaving a gaping void in your soul. The good news is that God has boundless grace and healing for you.

If you are a father who is working your best to be a good dad, yet constantly feels that you are failing, then go directly to your heavenly



Father. I can assure you He is eager for you to come to Him with your "father needs."

# Stir Up the Gift

It's comforting to realize that great

men and women throughout history, those who have accomplished amazing things for God, also had struggles. Just look at the lives of Moses, Deborah, or David in the Old Testament. And what of Mary, the mother of Jesus, or the apostle Paul? Each of these people had ample reason to give up along the way, yet they ultimately proved to be faithful.

Perhaps that's why Paul encouraged Timothy, his son in the faith, with these words: Therefore I remind you to stir up the gift of God which is in you through the laying on of my hands. For God continued ... *has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind* (2 Timothy 1:6–7).

When God looks at us, He sees the heart. He doesn't view us based on what we can do rather what He can do through us and what Jesus has done for us. God wants to demonstrate His goodness and faithfulness through us, as parents, to our families. This is why it's important that we develop three specific mindsets.

**First** is the mindset of *gratitude*. The word *gratitude* means "the quality of being thankful; readiness to show appreciation for and to return kindness."

Gratitude is such an important ingredient in faithfulness to families. Gratitude says, "I am thankful for you." Don't be neglectful to express your gratitude for members of your family. Let them know how much they mean to you.

**Second** is the mindset of *fellowship*. Perhaps the greatest words a parent can hear are, "I want to spend time with you," especially when their children become adults. When my children spend time with me, there's no greater joy in my life. I think it's the same for our heavenly Father, for the Bible says, *That which we have seen and heard we declare to you, that you also may have fellowship with us; and truly our fellowship is with the Father and with His Son Jesus Christ* (1 John 1:3).

Enoch was a man known for walking with God. In fact, the Bible says he walked faithfully with God, and had such close fellowship with Him that one day God just took him home (see Genesis 5:24). The Lord made this beautiful promise in Leviticus 26:12: "I will walk among you and be your God, and you shall be My people." Jesus said, "If anyone loves me, he will keep My word; and My Father will love him, and We will come to him and make Our home with him" (John 14:23).

Third is the mindset of *blessings*. It's important that our family members hear us say, "You are such a blessing to me." People are encouraged when they hear they are a blessing to us. That is what Paul did for Timothy; he encouraged the young man, strengthened him, lifted him from despair, and reassured him that he was still useful in God's kingdom. Likewise, we need to reassure one another, encourage one another. Let your family members and those around you know they are a blessing to you.

#### Be Mindful of God's Faithfulness

It's easier to be faithful to God when we remember His faithfulness to us. I'm reminded of the words of an old hymn: "When upon life's billows you are tempest bound, when you are discouraged thinking all is lost, count your many blessings, name them one by one, and it will surprise you what the Lord has done."

As human beings, we have the capacity to forget. We often forget that we are not where we are solely because of our own efforts. We forget what others have done for us, what God has done for us. I've learned that any time we forget what God has done, we begin to drift, to move backwards. This is why our families must see genuine faith and faithfulness to God.

Timothy had been blessed to grow up in a Christian home. Both his mother and grandmother were believers, teaching him the scriptures from an early age (see 2 Timothy 1:5). This was part of Timothy's spiritual heritage, part of the blessing God had bestowed upon him.

In his letter to the church at Ephesus, Paul said, Therefore be imitators of God [copy Him and follow His example], as well-beloved children [imitate their father]. And walk in love, [esteeming and delighting in one another] as Christ loved us and gave Himself up for us, a slain offering and sacrifice to God [for you, so that it became] a sweet fragrance (Ephesians 5:1–2 AMPC).

## Be faithful to your family.



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The Word of God says, The righteous shall flourish like a palm tree, he shall grow like a cedar in Lebanon. Those who are planted in the house of the LORD shall flourish in the courts of our God. They shall still bear fruit in old age; they shall be fresh and flourishing (Psalm 92:12–14). The Amplified Bible says, They shall be full of sap [of spiritual vitality], and verse 15 says, [They are living memorials] to show that the Lord is upright and faithful.

Through the psalmist God said, "Bring my faithful people to me—those who made covenant with me by giving sacrifices!" (Psalm 50:5 NLT). Clearly, God's plan is to plant His faithful, righteous ones where they will flourish.

Clarke's commentary says, "As these trees flourish in their respective soils and climates, so shall the righteous." One of the definitions of soil, as I believe it applies, is "a geographical area." Whether our "soil" is a local church or a designated geographical region, God has a specific place for each of us, one in which He intends that we flourish to the fullest.

Where do you attend church? Are you in your respective soil? If you are where God has planted you, you'll flourish; if you're not where God has planted you, He's under no obligation. I see people moving in and out of churches all the time. Some do not leave by God's direction; rather, they lean to their own understanding. If God has planted you in a church, your attitude should be, "No devil is going to move me out!"

The place where God plants you is where you'll find your vineyard; it's where your harvest is. Again, the Psalmist said, Those who are planted in the house of the LORD shall flourish (Psalm 92:13). The term "the house of the Lord" is symbolic of the universal New Testament Church, and, of course, the Church is all over the world. This means you need to find out where you belong. Don't ever get the idea that God doesn't have a local church for you, that you can make it all by yourself without a church. This is not the plan of God. Jesus shed His blood for your redemption; He established the local church. You need to find out which specific church you are to be planted in-and the keyword is planted.

Though we are to be planted according to God's will so that we may flourish, we must also do our part. It is up to each of us to provide something for God to work with, and that something is faith.

### Be Persistent in Faith

The Bible defines faith as "the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen" (see Hebrews 11:1). One of the most valuable lessons I've learned in over more than fifty years of ministry is to be persistent in my faith.

One of the meanings of persistence is *"to continue without wavering.*" Another is "a steady pursuit." In other words, persistence is refusing to give up. Now the question I have for you is this: how persistent is your faith? The Bible says, And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not (Galatians 6:9). If you're not reaping, it could be that you're fainting. You will reap if you faint not. The Message translation says, At the right time we will harvest a good crop if we don't give up.

Persistent faith never gives up. The Word of God says, *But as for you*, *brethren*, *do not grow weary in well doing* (2 Thessalonians 3:13); the Amplified Bible, Classic Edition, says it this way: *but continue in well-doing without weakening*. God wouldn't insist that our faith remain unmovable if He didn't intend to honor it, for we know [God] *is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him* (Hebrews 11:6). The Amplified Bible says He rewards those who *"earnestly and diligently"* seek Him. To be earnest is to be serious minded; to be diligent is to demonstrate a willingness to persevere.

What about your faith? Do you possess a persistent, unwavering kind of faith? If not, take hope from the Word of God, which says, *So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God* (Romans 10:17). Continually feed your spirit on the Word of God. From Bible times to present, every person of persistent faith came by it the same way: as the result of their hearing and

hearing and hearing the Word of God!

The Bible says, For you have need of endurance, so that after you have done the will of God, you may receive the promise (Hebrews 10:36). How important is it to you that God's promise is fulfilled in your life? How important is your health to you? How important is it that you flourish as God intends? If these issues are important to you, then they are important to God. Let this truth drive your determination to fuel your persistent faith as you press forward to victory.

#### Be Faithful

I've had the privilege of knowing and being mentored by a number of faithful men and women throughout the years. Having had the opportunity to closely study their lives and ministries, I've observed four specific attributes they—and all faithful believers—have in common.

First is adherence to duty. As believers, our duty is to love God, to serve God, and to remain loyal to Him. This sounds similar to the words Moses spoke to Israel just before they crossed into the Promised Land: "Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one! You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength" (Deuteronomy 6:4–5).

The Bible says we are to serve God in sincerity and in truth (see Joshua 24:14), which means without hypocrisy or false pretense. Sadly, many Christians talk about serving God, yet they live another way. Jesus said, "But why do you call Me 'Lord, Lord,' and do not the things which I say?" (Luke 6:46). Those who firmly adhere to duty are faithful to love God and to serve Him.

Second is adherence to truth. Many believers truly want to love and serve God—as long as they're healed, as long as their children are serving God. But what happens when things start to fall apart? That's when we find out if we are truly committed. So, what are we to do when we find ourselves facing overwhelming situations or obstacles and it seems God is nowhere to be found? We are to adhere to the truth, which *continued* ...

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is found only in the Word of God! Before He went to the cross, Jesus prayed these words: *Sanctify them by Your truth. Your Word is truth* (John 17:17). The definition of truth is "the highest form of reality that exists." Faithful people make the Word of God their final authority.

Third, God's faithful ones are constant and unwavering. The Word of God says, *Let us hold fast the profession of our faith without wavering*; *(for he is faithful that promised)* (Hebrews 10:23 KJV). Often referred to as "the father of our faith," Abraham was a man who refused to waver.

Let's see what the apostle Paul wrote about Abraham: *He did not waver at the promise of God through unbelief, but was strengthened in faith, giving glory to God, and being fully convinced that what He had promised He was also able to perform. And therefore "it was accounted to him for righteousness*" (Romans 4:20–22). The Word of God says, *God is no respecter of persons* (Acts 10:34); therefore, what He has done for others He will also do for you—if you remain faithfully constant and unwavering in faith. *Fourth, God's faithful ones are constant* 

sowers. Jesus said, "Give, and it will be given to you: good measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over" (Luke 6:38).

How long are we to be faithful in anything we do for God? According to Revelation 2:10, until death! Faithfulness is not seasonal, neither is sowing. We don't just try faithfulness and sowing for a little while; they are lifetime commitments.

Paul said, And let us not be weary in well doing; for in due season we shall reap, if we

faint not. As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith (Galatians 6:9–10). What is the "well doing" that Paul refers to? Sowing!

# God Is Faithful

The Bible says, "Therefore know that the LORD your God, He is God, the faithful God who keeps covenant and mercy for a thousand generations to those who love Him and keep His commandments" (Deuteronomy 7:9).

God confirmed His faithfulness to His Word, saying to the prophet Jeremiah, "Thou hast well seen, for I will hasten My word to perform it" (Jeremiah 1:12). The Amplified Bible, Classic Edition, says, I am alert and active, watching over My word to perform it. In other words, God is faithful; He sees to it that His Word is fulfilled. If God says something, He will back it.

Real Bible faith makes no provision for failure. As believers we don't think about failing; we don't make provision for it. Why? Because we have God's Word, and His Word is His bond. Real Bible faith is willing to stand on what God has promised, no matter how long it takes to come to pass.

The Bible says, *There has not failed* one word of all his good promise, which He promised (1 Kings 8:56). Who else but God has this kind of reputation, this testimony? Not one word has failed, not one good promise.

This is the God we serve—the One who said He would gather His faithful ones and that they would flourish!
