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Vince Lombardi is remembered as the coach of the Green Bay Packers who led his team to back-to-back league championships and two Super Bowl victories. Though he never had a losing season as a head coach in the NFL, Lombardi began each new football season by holding up the football and saying to his team, "Gentlemen, this is a football." Then he went on to the X's and O's, to blocking and tackling, and to passing and receiving—making the players go through these essentials over and again. In so doing, he was preventing his team from ever assuming that the basics were not relevant.

Lombardi's insistence on sticking with the basics enabled him to achieve a winning record of almost 74 percent in the regular season and an astounding 90 percent in the postseason. At his funeral, one of his former players eulogized him with these words: "He not only taught us how to win at football; he taught us how to be winners in life."



God intends each and every one of us to be winners in life. That's why He sent His Son, Jesus Christ, to pay the price for our redemption so that we could have access to all that God has prepared for us.

The word *redemption* in the original Greek language of the New Testament means "to ransom in full; salvation; deliverance." Redemption is the first step into the life of victory that God has planned for us; however, a victorious life doesn't just happen—especially when we're living in a time of unprecedented chaos in our world. We have a part to play in seeing God's promises for our lives come to pass, and it begins with our becoming established in the truth found in the Word of God.

I want to share with you seven basic—yet powerful—revelations from God's Word that will position you to be all God has called you to be and enable you to remain unmoved by the negative circumstances that surround you. The apostle Paul was established in these revelations, which the Lord Jesus Christ had personally shown him. Consequently, Paul was able to stand in the face of sickness, disease, shipwreck, and even demons, and say, *I am persuaded that neither death nor life, nor principalities nor powers, nor things present nor things to come … shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord* (Romans 8:38–39).

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The Reality of Redemption

The Bible describes how Jesus, our High Priest, obtained our redemption: *Not* with the blood of goats and calves, but with His own blood He entered the Most Holy place once for all, having obtained eternal redemption (Hebrews 9:12).

There are three important facts about the redemptive work of Christ that every believer should know: One, our redemption has already been obtained for us; it's a "done deal." Two, our redemption is an eternal redemption, meaning Satan is eternally defeated. Three, our redemption is operative now; we don't have to wait to get to heaven to enjoy its benefits.

Jesus, the Lamb of God, was the final sacrifice under the Abrahamic Covenant. When God proclaimed Him King of heaven and earth, Jesus returned to earth and said to His disciples, "*All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth. Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost*" (Matthew 28:18–19 KJV). Jesus took the power given Him from God and placed it in the hands of His followers. It is now our responsibility to keep Satan under our feet. The Bible says that *God raised Him from the dead and seated Him at His right hand in heavenly places, far above all principality and power and might and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this age but also in that which is to come (Ephesians 1:20–21).*

How does the reality of your redemption affect the things happening around you right now? Once you become established in this reality, you'll realize and operate in your authority as a believer and never again have to put up with anything Satan throws your way.

I am persuaded that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, ... shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord. (Romans 8:38–39 KJV)



The Reality of the New Birth

The apostle Paul described the new birth, saying, *Therefore*, *if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new* (2 Corinthians 5:17). The literal Greek translation of this verse says we are a "new species of being that never existed before."

The nature of God, which is eternal life, and the actual life of God were imparted to your spirit at the new birth. The Bible says you have been given exceedingly great and precious promises, that through these you may be partakers of the divine nature (2 Peter 1:4). Jesus said, "*T have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly*" (John 10:10). His life is the source of your ability because you now have full access to His ability, His wisdom, His anointing, His power, His love, and His faith. His divine nature takes into account all the attributes of God, and you are a partaker of that nature.

Sadly, many believers today are robbed of the blessings of God simply because they are not established in the reality of the new birth. Through ignorance, they have allowed Satan to continue to accuse them of things they did before they ever accepted Jesus, keeping them bound with feelings of condemnation and the false belief that God doesn't really love them. Without a revelation of the new birth firmly established in your spirit, you, too, could fall prey to Satan's deception and lies, and subsequently be robbed of the blessings of God that are already yours. Remember, the old you is dead and gone; the new birth is a reality. You are a new creation created in Christ Jesus.

You don't have to wait to get to heaven to enjoy eternal life—it's yours right now!

Being the Reality of Being the Righteousness of God

In his letter to the church in Corinth, Paul said, For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him (2 Corinthians 5:21). The word righteousness is an Old English word that simply means "right standing with God."

The Bible tell us that the "righteousness" of God, through faith in Jesus Christ, [is] to all and on all who believe (Romans 3:22). Someone might say, "Wait a minute, Brother Jerry, doesn't the Bible say 'there is none righteous, no not one'?" Yes, it does; however, in that reference Paul was speaking of man's own righteousness, which he described "as filthy rags." Jesus has given us His righteousness that we might become righteous in Him.

In Jesus, you have right-standing with the God of the universe, which allows you to stand in the presence of God Almighty without a sense of sin, guilt, fear, inferiority, or condemnation. You have just as much right to stand before God as Jesus does, because He purchased that right for you.

The revelation of righteousness will cause your prayer life to become very powerful, for the Bible says, *The earnest (heartfelt, continued) prayer of a righteous man makes tremendous power available [dynamic in its working]* (James 3:16 AMPC). If this is what the prayer of one righteous person can do, what do you suppose the prayers of two righteous people could do? Or ten. Or one hundred?

In many instances, the *Amplified Bible, Classic Edition*, describes God's righteous ones as the "uncompromisingly righteous." A person who is established in his or her right standing with God will not compromise where the Word of God is concerned. So, lean hard on your righteous standing with God; push it to its limits. When you do, you'll see Jesus, the High Priest of your confession, will back your faith with His power.

As the body of Christ, we are to be governing the circumstances around us with the Word of the living God. If your circumstances don't line up with the Word of God, then take the Word and change them based on these seven powerful revelations.

These seven basic revelations from God's Word will give you a firm foundation on which to stand as you face and overcome any situation in life. The realities of redemption, the new birth, righteousness, the indwelling of God, the authority of the name of Jesus, the integrity of God's Word, and the God-kind of faith are powerful weapons that belong to you. They are meant for you to use according to 2 Corinthians 10:3–4: For though we walk (live) in the flesh, we are not carrying on our warfare according to the flesh and using mere human weapons. For the weapons of our warfare are not physical [weapons of flesh and blood], but they are mighty before God for the overthrow and destruction of *strongholds* (AMPC).

When you allow these revelations from the Word of God to become real in your spirit, you'll walk away from every situation a winner—victorious in every area of your life!



The Reality of Being God-Indwelt

The Bible describes three types of relationship between God and man: (1) God for us, (2) God with us,

and (3) God in us. Throughout the Old Testament, people had access to only two of these relationships—God for them and God with them. When Old Testament saints operated in the revelation that God was for them and with them, there was absolutely no defeat in their lives.

You and I, however, have something they didn't have, because of Jesus Christ, of whom the Bible says, *But now He has obtained a more excellent ministry, inasmuch as He is also Mediator of a better covenant, which was established on better promises* (Hebrews 8:6). What do you suppose those Old Testament heroes could have done if they had God in them as you and I do? The feats performed by God through Moses, Elijah, Samson, David, and many more were tremendous, but they were nothing compared to the things every New Testament believer should be accomplishing today.

Jesus said, "Most assuredly, I say to you, he who believes in Me, the works that I do he will do also; and greater works than these he will do (John 14:12). In verse 17 He spoke of the Holy Spirit, saying, "But you know Him, for He dwells with you and will be in you."

The same Holy Spirit that took God's spoken declaration, "Let there be light!" and created sixteen billion miles of universe is a reality in your human spirit. When you walk, He walks. When you stretch forth your hand to pray for someone, He stretches forth His hand. No wonder the ministry of laying on of hands is so vital in the life of a Christian.

Get established the reality of being God-indwelt, and you'll experience all that comes with the revelation that He who is in you is greater than he who is in the world (1 John 4:4).



*The Reality of the Authority in Jesus*²

No other name in the universe carries the power that the name of Jesus carries. The Bible says, *God also has highly*

exalted Him and given Him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow ... and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of the Father (Philippians 2:9–11).

God conferred power on the name of Jesus and He has also delegated you to use that name to govern circumstances, demons, sickness, fear, and even hell itself, for Jesus said, "And in that day you will ask Me nothing. Most assuredly, I say to you, whatever you as the Father in My name He will give you" (John 16:23).

So, how did the name of Jesus obtain such vast power and authority? We find the answer in these verses: *God* ... *has in these last days spoken to us by His Son, whom He has appointed heir of all things* ... *as He has by inheritance obtained a more excellent name than they* (Hebrews 1:1–4). The power of Jesus' name was given to Him by God through inheritance. And now, also through inheritance, Jesus has given the body of Christ the authority and power to use that name. This means you have the right to use the name of Jesus to stop Satan and all his works. The forces of hell are subject to the name of Jesus, which carries all power and authority in heaven, in earth, and under the earth. Everything that is named must bow its knee to the name of Jesus!

6 The Reality of the Integrity of God's Word',

There is one truth that must be firmly established in your spirit if you want to become mature in the Lord, and here it is: God's Word is His integrity and His bond.

Through the prophet Jeremiah, God said, "I watch over my word to perform it" (Jeremiah 1:12 ASV). The Amplified Bible, Classic Edition, says, "I am alert and active, watching over My word to perform it." God also said, "So shall My word be that goes forth from My mouth; it shall not return to Me void, but it shall accomplish what I please, and it shall prosper in the thing for which I sent it" (Isaiah 55:11). According to Mark 16:20, God confirms His Word with signs following.

The Word of God is your Father's bond to you. Whenever He says something, you can be assured He will back it with His actions. The best way to become truly aware of God's integrity is to actively develop your own integrity. Be ready to back your word with actions. For instance, if you say you will be at a certain place at a certain time, make sure you do so. Be aware of the things you promise.

God has given you His Word, and He will back that Word with action. When this truth becomes reality in your heart, your faith will become more highly developed. You will not be afraid to act on His Word, which is established in the blood covenant between God Almighty and the man named Jesus Christ.

When you made Jesus your Savior and Lord, you became a partaker of that covenant. Whatever belongs to Jesus also belongs to you. When you let the reality of the integrity of God's Word become established in your spirit, you'll not hesitate to act on His Word. And He will watch over His Word to perform it in your behalf!

The Reality of the "God Kind of Faith" Residing in You

The apostle John wrote these words by inspiration of the Holy Spirit: *Whoever* believes that Jesus is the Christ is born of God ... For whatever is born of God overcomes the world. And this is the victory that has overcome the world—our faith (1 John 5:1–4).

Jesus said, "Have faith in God" (Mark 11:22) or "Have the God kind of faith." When you received Jesus, this God kind of faith was given to you. Paul tells us that, God has dealt to every man the measure of faith (Romans 12:3). You already have all the faith you will ever need; however, you will need to develop it. Doing so comes through spending time in the Word of God, for the Bible says, So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God (Romans 10:17).

In revelation #2 we learned that we are partakers of the divine nature of God, and that nature includes His faith. The God kind of faith resides in you right now, and that is a revelation that brings this astounding promise from Jesus: "If you can believe, all things are possible to him who believes" (Mark 9:23).

Are you a believer? If so, then all things are possible unto you!

Basic Principles for

Prayer is neither an activity, a ritual, or an obligation, nor is it begging God to do what we want Him to do. Prayer is communion and communication with God that touches His heart.

When we understand the Bible's principles of prayer, we can communicate with God in power, grace, and confidence. The very heart of prayer is communion with God and unity of love and purpose.

Prayer is meant to be answered; otherwise, God would not ask us to pray. He isn't interested in wasting our time and efforts—He is interested in results. Jesus prayed to His Father and said, *"And I know that you always hear Me"* (John 11:42).

Prayer was born out of God's heart-arrangement for mankind's assignment on earth. God spoke forth this arrangement when He said, "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the *cattle, over all the earth and over every* creeping thing that creeps on the earth" (Genesis 1:26). The words God spoke are critical to our understanding the principles of prayer, since they define the relationship that the Creator intended and desired with mankind and planet earth.

God's mandate for mankind to dominate the earth was established in the declaration above, but the parameters of that dominion were established with the words "let them." God defined the boundaries of His right to legally influence and intervene in the earth realm based on the principle of God's integrity and His commitment to His Word. Why is this fact so important? Because of these three foundational principles:

- God has placed His Word above even Himself
- God will never violate or break His Word
- God's holiness is the foundation of His integrity and faithfulness

These eternal principles are affirmed by the psalmist, who said, Your word, LORD, is eternal; it stands firm in the heavens. Your faithfulness continues through all generations; you established the earth, and it endures (Psalms 119:89–90 NIV) and I will worship toward Your holy temple, and praise Your name for Your lovingkindness and Your truth; for You have magnified Your word above all Your name (Psalms 138:2).

The Word Is the Foundation

Prayer is the means we use to give God the legal right and permission to intervene in earth's affairs. The three foundational principles above are essential in our understanding the nature and purpose of prayer. God's Word is the foundational material for our prayers regarding provision, healing, deliverance, power, protection, endurance, patience, authority, faith, praise, thanksgiving, confidence, assurance, boldness, and peace. God's Word is the supply for our every need.

Knowing God's will gives us confidence in our prayers. We know God's will by knowing His Word and finding scripture verses that pertain to the specific situations for which we are praying. I first pray and ask the Holy Spirit to lead me through God's Word and to show me scripture verses that pertain to my need.

Actively seeking to know God's will and gathering the necessary information to pray effectively give the confidence of getting results. The Bible says, *Now this is the confidence that we have in Him, that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us. And if we know that He hears us, whatever we ask, we know that we have the petitions that we have asked of Him (1 John 5:14–15).*

After I've gone to God's Word, I have found specific verses and promises that pertain to my needs, and have prayed them out loud. I then pray 1 John 5:14–15 and affirm Jesus' words in John 11:41–42: "Father, I thank You that You have heard Me. And I know that You always hear me, but because of the people who are

standing by I say this, that they may believe that You sent Me."

We have to cultivate the Godkind of faith, for the Bible says, "The just shall live by faith" (Romans 1:17) and But without faith it is impossible to please [God] (Hebrews 11:6). The Word of God becomes the foundation of our faith. We have to make God's Word final authority on any situation we pray about. If we didn't have the Word of God, then we would have no foundation for our faith. The Bible says, So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God (Romans 10:17).

Without the Word of God, we wouldn't know what His will is about anything; therefore, we'd not be able to exercise any faith whatsoever in His doing something for us. We would have no idea what He would and wouldn't do in any situation.

Prayer and Thanksgiving

Giving thanks to God is a vital component of believing that we receive when we pray. God favors those who have an attitude of gratitude, which is why it is important to begin our prayers with thanksgiving, and end them with thanksgiving and praise to the God who makes all things possible.

Faith believes we receive when we pray. The Bible says, *Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen* (Hebrews 11:1). In other words, faith is our evidence of God's answers to our prayers. In his letter to the believers in Philippi, the apostle Paul said, Do not fret or have anxiety about anything, but in every circumstance and in everything, by prayer and petition (definite requests), with thanksgiving, continue to make your wants known to God (Philippians 4:6 AMPC). Our prayers should always include thanksgiving. In fact, it's wise to enter God's presence with thanksgiving, making it the first thing we do.

The psalmist wrote, Enter into His gates with thanksgiving, and into His courts with praise. Be thankful to Him, and bless His name (Psalms 100:4). Thanking God for what He has already done and what we believe He will do causes our faith to rise to a new level of expectancy. Thanksgiving causes us to be energized as our spirits are enlivened. Then, when we add praise to prayer, we are moved to thank God for His goodness, mercy, love, and grace-thereby opening unlimited possibilities in prayer.

It's humbling to think God will take the time to hear our prayers. Remember the words of Peter: Therefore humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you in due time, casting all your care upon Him, for He cares for you (1 Peter 5:6).

Every prayer based on the Word of God and offered in faith by a person in right relationship with God is answered. And it's only a matter of time until that answer is evidenced. God answers as soon as we ask, but those answers are revealed in His timing. That is why Jesus told His disciples that they should always pray and not give up (see Luke 18:1).

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When I was asked to write an article on tithing for this edition of Adventures in Faith magazine, I thought back to 1982 when I had just graduated from Dr. Savelle's Bible school. I had been a public schoolteacher for ten years, and after graduation I sensed the Lord had a new direction for my life. I asked Him, "Lord, what do You have for me to do now?" I heard something very surprising: "Study tithing." That was an unexpected reply.

I went to various bookstores looking for anything on tithing, and all I found was one small pamphlet at a Baptist bookstore. I decided to type up all the scriptures from Vine's Concordance with the words tithe, tithing, tithed, first fruits, firstborn, firstling, etc. Then I began meditating verse by verse upon those scriptures.

One other thing I did was seek statistics on how many Christians were tithing. In 1982, I discovered that only 11% of Christians were committed tithers. For this article, I looked up tithing statistics again and found that at the most, only 4-5% of Christians are tithing today. That's a drop of over 50% since 1982. Current statistics say that out of the over 247 million US citizens who identify as Christians, only 1.5 million are loyal tithers. What a difference it would make if every Christian in the US tithed. It would add a staggering \$139 billion dollars to faith causes and vastly increase the church's impact upon this nation and the nations of the world.

First, let's define the word *tithe*. Tithe simply means "a tenth part." In other words, whatever comes into your hands, ten percent belongs to God and ninety percent belongs to you. If your salary per week is \$250 dollars, then the tithe would be \$25.

People ask, "Do I tithe on the gross or the net?" It's a choice all of us have to make. I tithe on the gross because that is what comes into my hands. Yes, the government does take its part, but my conviction is that God's part supersedes the government's part.

eart of Tithing

I asked the Lord one time why He chose the tenth part to establish His covenant with man. Why not another measurelike one-fifth or an eighth? One day, I was sitting at a small table, when I asked this question again. Suddenly, the table and the wall disappeared, and I was in another realm. The Lord stood up, took one step toward me, leaned forward, opened both of His hands, and said, "It means I have dealt with My man openhandedly. I have withheld nothing from him."

Looking at both of His open hands, I understood why He chose the tenth. It's clear that the tithe, the tenth part, is not an arbitrary number. It signifies that all of God, all of His kingdom, and all of His resources are available to us through His covenant. Psalm 84:11 confirms this: For the LORD God is a sun and shield; the LORD will give grace and glory; no good thing will He withhold from those who walk uprightly (NKJV).

The word *tithe* is first mentioned in Genesis 14. The principle can be found earlier in Genesis, but the first

use of the word tithe is associated with Abraham, the father of faith. The story is told of Lot's captivity and rescue by Abram (Abraham's name before God changed it). Upon Abram's return from defeating the kings who had captured his nephew Lot, he is met by Melchizedek. Genesis 14:18-20 reads: Then Melchizedek king of Salem brought out bread and wine; he was the priest of God Most High. And he blessed him and said: 'Blessed be Abram of God Most High, Possessor of heaven and earth; and blessed be God Most High, who has delivered your enemies into your hand? And he gave him a tithe of all.

These scriptures are significant. In other words, Abram gave Melchizedek one-tenth of all the bounty he had captured. Abraham came from a family of idol worshippers, but now he was separated from that life to a life of worshipping God. Out of the blessing that was in his possession, he worshipped God with ten percent. That blessing worked all throughout Abraham's life until the very end, and it went on to future generations. Genesis 24:1 says: Now Abraham was old, well advanced in years, and the Lord had blessed Abraham in all things (AMPC). In Genesis 28:20-22, we read that his grandson Jacob also tithed. Then Jacob made this vow: "If God will indeed be with me and protect me on this journey, and if He will provide me with food and clothing, and if I return safely to my father's home, then the LORD will certainly be my God. And this memorial pillar I have set up will become a place for worshiping God, and I will present to God *a tenth of everything He gives me*" (NLT). Notice, Abraham and Jacob tithed to God before the law was instituted. Tithing is practiced before the law, during the law, and passed through the cross into New Testament practice.

Lordship

At the heart of tithing is the issue of *lordship* in the life of the believer. Who and what is going to rule and reign over our lives? Tithing is a covenant expression of the honor and love we have for God in our hearts. Honor begins in our hearts as we purposefully and consciously decide to put God first in every area of our lives, including our finances.

How, then, do we practice His lordship? We choose to love and honor Him more than anyone or anything else. We express honor for Him when He is first place in everything. Choosing to honor God above money, men, houses, land, business, fame, or anything else this life offers is vital for divine, heavenly order to be established in all our ways. Tithing establishes this principle of putting God first in everything.

Tithing was practiced before the law, and then it was codified in the law of Moses. Leviticus 27:30 says: *And all the tithe of the land, whether of the seed of the land or of the fruit of the tree, is the LORD'S. It is holy to the LORD.* The word *holy* means "sacred; to be set apart for the Lord." We know that the Lord is holy and His tithe is holy. Tithing isn't something to be done occasionally or carelessly. It is holy to the Lord, and we are to handle it with the utmost respect and honor.

In the book of Malachi, the people had returned from their exile in Babylon to the land of promise over one hundred years before. Even though they had rebuilt the temple where they worshipped, they were discouraged, apathetic, depressed, poor, and for the most part, living immoral lives. They were in such severe spiritual decline that they struggled to believe God even cared for them. Their lives were chaotic and out of order.

In Malachi 1:2(NIV), God spoke to them saying, "*I have loved you*." Cynically, they replied to Him, "*How have You loved us?*" Although they knew of God, they were neither glorifying Him nor were they grateful for the mercy and compassion He had always shown to His people. Then in verse 6, the Lord asked a powerful question: "*Where is My honor? And if I am a Master, where is My reverence?*"(*NKJV*) The Lord couldn't find any honor among His priests or people.

This was reflected in their tithes and offerings. Malachi 1:8 says: "When you offer blind animals for sacrifice, is that not wrong? When you sacrifice lame or diseased animals, is that not wrong? Try offering them to your governor! Would he be pleased with you? Would he accept you?" says the LORD Almighty (NIV).

Rather than honor God, both the priests and the people were expressing contempt for Him. He even told them they should extinguish the fire on the altar where they burned sacrifices because the fires of love for Him were already extinguished in their hearts. They disdained His presence and the holy things of worship, especially the tithe. Yet God's love for them never changed.

In Malachi 3:7–11(NKJV), He addressed their disobedience and lack of honor by saying:

"Yet from the days of your fathers you have gone away from My ordinances and have not kept them. Return to Me, and I will return to you, says the Lord of hosts. But you said, 'In what way shall we return?'

"Will a man rob God? Yet you have robbed Me! But you say, 'In what way continued on next page

have we robbed You?' In tithes and offerings. You are cursed with a curse, for you have robbed Me, even this whole nation. Bring all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be food in My house, and try Me now in this," says the Lord of hosts, "If I will not open for you the windows of heaven and pour out for you such blessing that there will not be room enough to receive it. And I will rebuke the devourer for your sakes, so that he will not destroy the fruit of your ground, nor shall the vine fail to bear fruit for you in the field," says the Lord of hosts.

The Father graciously spoke to His people to return to Him. How? He instructed them to bring their tithes and offerings and worship Him. In response, He would open the windows of heaven and pour out blessing upon blessing until they were blessed beyond compare to any other people or nation. Also, He would rebuke the enemy who was stealing, killing, and destroying their blessing.

We Can Change the World

I've been pondering how significant it could be to the Third Great Awakening in America that many Christians are praying for if people dusted off these scriptures and began to worship God once again with the tithe. I believe the impact of all Christians lovingly and worshipfully bringing their tithes and offerings to God could change the whole world.

Did Jesus have anything to say about tithing? Yes, He did, and He was for it! Matthew 23:23 says: "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you pay tithe of mint and anise and cummin and have neglected the weightier matters of the law: justice and mercy and faith. These you ought to have done, without *leaving the others undone*" (NKJV). Jesus rebuked the religious leaders for their lack of love, honor, and faith even as they meticulously tithed from their herb gardens. He makes it clear that simply giving a tenth is not enough. The motive, intent, and action of a pure heart is of the greatest importance in the kingdom.

In the New Testament, it's important to understand that the believer on this side of the cross lives under grace. It's not just about what we're commanded to do; it's about passionately desiring to love and serve God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength. From the beginning, God has longed for us to give Him our heart before we give Him anything else.

For the New Testament believer, tithing is only the beginning of our giving. Under grace, we certainly would not give less than the tithe. The Lord desires our love for Him and others to become so great that our prayer is: "Lord, all that I am and all that I have is Yours. Whatever You ask of me, I'm willing to give. Please use my life for Your glory." He wants a people who are renowned for being generous, kind-hearted, and full of mercy toward others, including those who are hurting, poor, and needy.

Hebrews 7:8 says, *Here mortal men receive tithes, but there he receives them, of whom it is witnessed that he lives* (NKJV). Mortal men do still receive tithes on earth. Tithing is a covenant principle that establishes the lordship of Jesus Christ. Here, mortal men receive tithes and offerings so that the house of God and the work of God may flourish in the earth. There, in heaven, our High Priest Jesus receives our honor, our love, and our prayers, confessions, and commitments to fulfill His will. When we tithe, both heaven and earth are blessed.

So much more could be written, but I want to close by making mention of a powerful principle in Matthew 6:21 that aligns with tithing. I love this scripture in the *Amplified Bible: For where your treasure is, there your heart [your wishes, your desires; that on which your life centers] will be also.*

When we put our earthly treasure, starting with our tithes, into the kingdom of God with hearts of honor, love, and faith, we'll find everything begins to shift. Our lives begin to develop a divine focus. The will of heaven begins to supersede everything else. The things of this world lose their power to distract and distort our lives, and our hearts become filled with the divine passions of God's own heart.

I've often taught the principle that everything with God starts with our heart. I Samuel 16:7 says, But the Lord said to Samuel, *"For the Lord does not see as man sees; for man looks at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart"* (NKJV).

As we faithfully worship the Father with our tithes and offerings, may He look on our hearts and be even more blessed by the honor, worship, and love He sees there.

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rowing up I had the idea that God was so far away, an entity that couldn't be touched or reached, and only the perfect could get His attention. As I look back on my life, I realize religion had a way of promising freedom, while at the same time creating bondage and barriers. I didn't think I was good enough to get in God's presence. I now believe I would have surrendered my life earlier if I had known the basics of what a life of following Christ looked like. You see, it is not just following the leader in a single file line, but it's about seeing the way the "GodMan (Jesus)" lived His life.

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GETING INTO THE PRESENCE OF GOD

His Presence Must Be a Priority

We can see the basics of getting in the presence of God by looking at our greatest example, and that's Jesus. The first thing we can see when we look at Jesus is that His number one priority was His relationship with His Father. He said of Himself, "Apart from the Father I can't do anything" and "I only do the things I see My Father do, and I only say the things I hear My Father say."

We can only hear and see when we are in close proximity to Jesus. Jesus didn't have great success because He was Jesus. He had great success because He chose to live a life in the presence of His Father, and that is what is required of us as well. We even see His desperation on the cross when He said, "Father why have You forsaken me?"

We see this desire for the presence of God in others throughout God's Word. We see it with Moses in Exodus 33 when he said, "Isn't it Your going with us that makes us distinguished?" We see it with Joshua in Joshua 1: "As I was with Moses so I will be with you." We see it with David when he required God's presence as his vital necessity throughout the Psalms. This first thought must become our thought: His presence is a vital necessity. The word vital means "it's life or death, it's success or failure, it's the difference maker." Jesus realized that God was not just "a" requirement in His life, but God was "the" thing in His life. Consider deleting this difficult sentence that defines God as a thing.

Quality Time with God

As we continue to look at Jesus and follow Him, we see that He set aside quality time with God. There are times we see that Jesus would get up early in the morning. There are times He would get away from the crowd to quiet places. And we read of Him on the mountain side or praying in the garden. So, what does quality time with God look like for us?

First, spending time in God's Word is a necessity. It says in Luke 2 that as a young man, Jesus grew in wisdom and favor with God and man. He did that through the Word of God. For me personally, there are times when I get into God's Word and His presence fills the room. The Holy Spirit will reveal the Word to me and open my eyes to revelation about who God is and who I am in God, and the revelation is life-changing and changes the course of my life.

Second, developing a life of prayer is a necessity. Prayer is communion with God and partnership with God. Prayer is a time of worship and thanksgiving and calling upon His name. Psalm 100:4 says, *Enter into His gates with thanksgiving, and into His courts with praise*. It's a fact that when I start praising and thanking God, I enter into His presence. In reality, I'm creating an atmosphere filled with God wherever I am when I release praise and thanksgiving.

God said, "*Call to Me, and I will answer you, and show you great and mighty things, which you do not know*" (Jeremiah 33:3). When I call on Him, He answers and He shows. In the Bible, when a group of priests, singers, and trumpeters declared "*For the Lord is good and His mercy endures forever*" (see 2 Chronicles 5:11–14), the presence of God came in such a way that the priests could not stand to minister because of that presence.

Know that God desires to be up close and personal with His creation. When you pray, worship, and praise, you invite him in.

Third, spending quality time with God must be intentional. I believe He was tempted in all areas of life. I believe, just like Jesus, our time with God will have to be intentional. Life is busy and everything can be pulling at us. We must set aside a specific time, on purpose, whether first thing in the morning or in the evening, whatever works best, to have uninterrupted time in God's Word and His presence. Doing so is vital to our lives and our success. I encourage you to set aside quality time with God. Start with five, ten, or fifteen minutes if that's all you can do, and before long, that time will increase. Spending time with God is not a religious duty; it's vital and will change you from the inside out.

Jesus gave us access to the Father by His blood so that we could come near. Hebrews 4 says we have a High Priest (Jesus), and because of Him we can come boldly to God and receive mercy and find grace. Know that God's presence is available, and according to Psalm 16:11, *in His presence is fullness of joy and at His right hand are pleasures forever more.*

What are you waiting for? Know His presence is vital and set aside quality time, and you will know what it means to walk with God.

God knows what we are supposed to be doing each day. He knows the end from the beginning. When we get into the presence of God, He will instruct us concerning these things. Furthermore, He will lead and guide us in the gifts of the Spirit necessary for each moment of each day. Every day, it is our choice to flow with the Spirit of God.

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God's desire is that we live a glorious life. Ephesians 1:4, 11-12 in The Message declares that, Long before he laid down earth's foundations, he had us in mind, had settled on us as the focus of his love, to be made whole and holy by his love, and long before we first heard of Christ and got our hopes up, he had his eye on us, had designs on us for glorious living. God wants us to live a blessed lifestyle not just some of the time, but all the time. This means He wants us to be led by His Spirit all the time, not just some of the time, so that the blessings of God overtake us. Deuteronomy 28:2 says it like this, "All these blessings shall come upon you and overtake you, because you obey the voice of the LORD your God" (NKJV). Hearing the voice of God and obeying His commands becomes key to this glorious life.

Hear and Obey

Hearing and obeying will work all over the world. Let me give you an example from one of my first trips to Africa. I was told that I could not preach prosperity in Africa. Well, God doesn't say the blessing is dependent on where you live, rather on hearing and obeying. So, in a men's meeting I gave a message titled "How Can We Be Blessed?" to a bunch of nonworking men. Under the anointing, I told them to go out and begin doing something for their community and that God would bless the work of their hands. Fifteen of the men did just that. They began cleaning up the streets, picking up trash for no pay. One day a government official saw them and asked why they were doing that work. They responded that God had told them to. Later,

the government rewarded each of those men with a half-acre of land, which they then used to grow crops and various necessities. These fifteen men became wealthy. The blessing overtook them. Why? Because they listened and obeyed.

Of course, it all starts with hearing. How do we hear from God? A very good place to start is to begin your day with praise and worship. Put God first place in your day. Worship Him and get into His presence so that you can hear what He is saying. Sing songs about Him and His goodness.

We must worship God in spirit and in truth. We need to hear from Him out of reverence because we recognize that He knows all things, and not go to Him only when we are in fear or under pressure. We must allow our spirits, not our flesh, to hear and make decisions.

Thank Him for the day. Ask Him to teach you, talk to you, and lead you— and He will.

Years ago, I was being led by the Spirit of God for one of our family vacations. We set out for the trip packed and ready, but not really sure where to go. I just decided to drive and follow God's promptings. Remember, God knows all things. God knew where we should stay, what we would enjoy, and what would be going on where we were going. We ended up in Colorado in a community I had never heard of and in a hotel where I had never stayed. Our family had the absolute best time there. We had access to fishing tours, and there was a tradeshow in town that we "just happened on." God knew what we would like.

We miss out when we don't hear from God.

Spend Time with God

There is no replacement for spending time with God. We can spend time with God through praise, worship, praying in the Spirit, and reading the Word, all of which we can do anywhere. We can be in contact with God anywhere. And since He speaks Spirit to spirit, we can hear Him in any situation and at any time.

The important thing is to welcome the Holy Spirit daily and be attentive to Him. Whether you are in church or out of church, listen for His voice. For example, learn to hear from Him in church during any part of the service, even announcements. Just as when I spoke to that group of men in Africa, God can send you a message through your pastor or someone speaking in your church. Don't miss that message by sleeping through the service or not paying attention. God wants to speak to you, and He will speak to you. Your part is to listen and then obey.

When you hear the voice of God, what He says will always line up with His Word. Always. One time, a lady asked me to agree with her that she would get married. I knew marriage was God's will, so I said yes. But then she continued to tell me that she was sure she knew who God had picked out for her: a man who was another women's husband! Of course, I told her I could not agree with her. God will never give anyone instructions that contradict His Word.

Worship in Spirit and Truth

We must worship God in spirit and in truth. We need to hear from Him out of reverence because we recognize that He knows all things, and not go to Him only when we are in fear or under pressure. We must allow our spirits, not our flesh, to hear and make decisions. There will be many times when God will lead us to do something our flesh does not want to do. We don't do what God says because we "feel" like it; we do it to obey Him.

When you do hear God tell you what to do, the devil will always try to get you in fear. Fear is the opposite of faith. Don't pray out of fear or confess out of fear. It is faith that overcomes. When you recognize you are in fear, you must battle your thoughts. Your spirit must battle your flesh. Don't stay down because of circumstances; have faith in God! Refuse to get into confusion or contention. Don't be moved by how you feel or what you see in the natural. Hold fast to the Word you were given.

Before I came to JSMI, God used my business to teach me how to hear Him. (He will use wherever you are and whatever you are doing to teach you too.) God would tell me what to buy to resell, and what not to buy. Remember, God knows all things even what will sell. One time He told me to buy a product that was five times as expensive as what I would usually buy. My thoughts were that I could buy five of other things and make five profits, gaining more than I could on that one product. But what did God say? So, I bought it, and then it sat on a shelf for months.

The devil came right to me with thoughts that I didn't hear from God and couldn't hear from God. I felt like a fool. One day, a man walked in and asked how much money I wanted for the item on the shelf. Well, I had paid \$250 for it, and because I was just about ready to give up on making any profit, I answered the man that I would take three. He said, "I'll take it," and then he took out a roll of hundreds and began counting: one hundred, two hundred, three hundred, but he didn't stop. He counted out \$3000. When I said I'd take three. I meant three hundred, but he took it as three thousand. That was much more than I could've gained on my other products. God knows who will walk into your business and what they are looking for and what they value. Let God speak to you, and then simply obey.

Obedience vs. Sense

Lastly, please remember that when God speaks, what He says won't always make sense to you in the natural. It doesn't have to. Oftentimes, people make decisions based on money. They pick jobs based on money, buy homes based on money, and decide whether or not to get medical help based on money. Don't be moved by money. Money is not a determining factor in godly decision-making. Matthew 6:24 in *The Message* declares, *"You can't worship two gods at once. Loving one god, you'll end up hating the other. Adoration of one feeds contempt for the other. You can't worship God and Money both.*" Money is not your God. Don't listen to money; listen to God—even when what He says doesn't make sense.

Never forget that according to Deuteronomy 28, it is hearing and obeying God that will cause the blessings to overtake you. You won't always know how it will work, but you do know it will work. Spend time with God, in contact with God. Get His direction and obey. Be led by the Spirit; you will be blessed every time.

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SOWING & REAPING Eric Deaton

The Lord appeared to Dr. Savelle in 1992 in Bournemouth, England, and asked him this question, "What was the first gift I gave to man after creating him?" Dr. Savelle responded with, "You gave man dominion and authority." The Lord then said, "What was the second gift?" After going back and looking in his Bible, Dr. Savelle realized that the second gift God gave to man was seed: And God said, "See I have given you every herb that yields seed which is on the face of all the earth and every tree whose fruit yields seed; to you it shall be for food" (Genesis 1:29).

It has been God's design from the beginning for man to be a sower, and, of course, since we are made in the image of God, this is how our Father lives also. We were made to live like God, talk like God, and act like God. God is a sower. He set this spiritual law and promise in place in Genesis 8:22: "While the earth remains, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, winter and summer, and day and night shall not cease." So, let's see: Do day and night still exist? Yes. Do cold and heat still exist? Yes. This means that seedtime and harvest also still exist. God cannot lie. The idea of seedtime and harvest is that they will be a regular recurrence—just like winter and summer, day and night.

Without sowing seed there can be no harvest. Many Christians get excited when the word harvest is mentioned. "Oh yeah! I'm believing for my harvest!" "I'm standing for my harvest." Then it becomes, "Lord where's this harvest You promised?" "Does this sowing and reaping really work?" Yes, it works, just like day and night and winter and summer. My question to them would be, "Are you a sower?" They might first say, "Yes, I sowed in last week's offering at church." Sowing one time or several times or even multiple times doesn't make someone a sower.

Sowing is an all-the-time thing. Sowing is a lifestyle—especially for those who want harvesting to be a lifestyle.

What if sometimes there were days and sometimes there were nights? That's not the way it is. God has set these laws in motion. If I am continuously sowing, then I should be continuously harvesting.

In the New Testament, the Word

of God repeats the principle from Genesis 1 in 2 Corinthians 9:10: Now may He who supplies seed to the sower. and bread for food, supply and multiply the seed you have sown and increase the fruits of your righteousness. Some may say, "Well I don't really have anything to sow" or "If I had a million dollars, I would sow," but both statements are false. We've already read that God gives seed to the sower; therefore, we always have something to sow.

I remember hearing a story about how, during a church service, Brother Kenneth Copeland didn't have any money to give in an offering, but he wanted to give. The Lord reminded him that he had a pencil, and he should give that. So, he gave the pencil. Then, after the service, someone came up to him and gave him \$20. He hurried back to find an usher so that he could give that \$20 in the offering. Brother Copeland gave of what he had, and God provided the seed.

Galatians 6:7 from the J.B. Phillips

New Testament adds, "A man's harvest in life depends entirely on that which he sows." In other words, our lives today are a result of what we sowed yesterday. I've heard Dr. Savelle say many times, "If what you have doesn't meet your need, then sow it as a seed." He and Mrs. Savelle have lived by this principle for 52 years. I remember them telling the story of how he was leaving to go out of town to preach and left her with \$3—it was all he had. She had two kids to feed and wouldn't see Dr. Savelle for three weeks. Long story short is that the

\$3 didn't meet their need. So, what did she do? She sowed it as a seed, and a financial harvest came that took care of their family for the next three weeks. Do you have a need in your life, and don't know how your need will be met? Then sow seed.

If you are in a difficult situation, this is the perfect time to sow some seed. Psalm 126:5 in *The Message*

> paraphrase says, So those who plant their crops in despair will shout hurrahs at the harvest. If there was anyone in despair, it was the widow woman in 1 Kings 17 who was making a last meal for herself and her son and then they were going to die. Elijah

the prophet came in and said to make him a meal first and then afterward make some for herself and her son. Can you imagine? He gave her a word from the Lord that the bin of flour would not be used up nor the jar of oil run dry until the Lord sent rain. The Bible says she went and did according to the word of the Lord, which means she obeyed, and she reaped a harvest of unlimited flour and oil. Wow! What if she had not obeyed and sowed that last meal? She and her son would be dead. Her son later got sick, and Elijah was still there to raise him from the dead. Ecclesiastes 11:4, 6 says, *He who observes the wind will not* sow, and he who regards the clouds will not reap. In the morning sow your seed, and in the evening do not withhold your hand; for you do not know which will prosper, either this or that, or whether both alike will be good. This clearly tells me that my sowing is not dictated by the circumstances going on around me.

You really find out where your faith is when times are difficult. Satan will always try to distract you with some circumstance or hard time to get you out of doing the Word of God. But the Word is the same and works regardless of whether the times and seasons and circumstances are good or bad. If you really want to stick it in the devil's face, sow more in difficult times. It's a demonstration of your faith, that you trust in God and not your money.

I just recently heard Dr. Savelle talking about Mark 4 and how only after a seed is sown does it become, and it becomes greater - greater than the seed itself. For example, a tomato seed, when it is sown, becomes a tomato. An apple seed, when it is sown, becomes an apple. A cucumber seed, when it is sown, becomes a cucumber. Genesis says that every seed will produce after its own kind. The point Dr. Savelle was making was that if the seed is never sown, it can never become what God intended it to be.

Now after your seed is sown, you should water it with the washing of the water of the Word of God. You wouldn't plant a seed and not water it. Speak the Word over the seeds you've sown. Your mouth is the sickle that brings in the harvest.

If you want the harvest that God desires for you in these end times, you must continue (or start) to sow seed as a lifestyle. This is the life of faith. This is how God designed man to live from the beginning, by the basic Bible principle of sowing and reaping.
